COUNTDOWN TO ART IN THE PARK



THE HEALING POWER OF ART

By some yardsticks, Jeanne Thieme and her husband Mike have it all. Jeanne Maguire Thieme is an award-winning artist whose watercolors have hung in major exhibits and now hang in delighted people's homes. Jeanne and Mike raised their two daughters in a charming New Hampshire town in a warm and welcoming home that their grandchildren now enjoy as well. In the barn and fields surrounding their homestead, horses were lovingly tended and for more than three decades the family's activities centered around their horse family and Pipe Dream Farm.

And then one day last summer when Jeanne was 72 years old, an unexpected fall off the back of her horse changed everything. Jeanne will express how grateful she is that the fall didn't kill or permanently incapacitate her. But it did cause a broken right collarbone and a broken left wrist, effectively straight-jacketing her for the summer and early fall. Mike, as a professional plumber and facilities manager, a jack-of-all-trades was there to help initially. But he too was decommissioned—by a scheduled knee replacement. In one quick tumble, the curtains on their life full of horses were closing.

The hugely emotional decision was made. The horses went to new homes. But they stayed in Jeanne's heart.

And here's how she handled it all.

When she could recover enough to paint Jeanne began creating a mural for the side of the barn where over the years eleven horses had resided. Her immense artistic gifts assured that this is no static, predictable scene. It is a full wall of

Jeanne recalls, "Poignant memories flooded back as I painted each horse. The connection to a horse was more than riding. I loved taking care of them, the physical work involved and building a relationship with a horse—we became a team.""

The story of the mural has interesting side stories, for example: Her four grandchildren have painted the sky and background (see below). Notable artist Peter Granucci has consulted on the artistic execution of the work. Finish carpenter Ken Greatbatch crafted a frame enclosure. And Jeanne has compiled a 10-minute photo tribute to the horses. Jeanne's horses have brought joy to her family, neighbors and a larger community over many years. Friends and family were invited to the debut of the mural on June 29 at which the photo program was shown prior to the unveiling.

Recognizing the possibility that the healing power of art could benefit others, Jeanne is willing to share her story. She says, "I am an artist—the mural illustrates the healing power of Art. As I painted this mural, pain and loss turned into gratitude that I had 35 wonderful years with these horses—a Pipe Dream had come true for me. My story illustrates how animals can influence lives, change the course of a person's life."

The title of the mural sums it up: "TRIBUTE."
